Cambridgeshire County Council Report

Local government reorganisation

We step ever closer to councils agreeing which proposals to submit for the government to consider for the local government reorganisation of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough on 28 November. Each council is only able to recommend one proposal and then the government will decide and consult on how they want to proceed early next year. The County Council continues to support the submission of Option A, which combines East and South Cambridgeshire with the City. Many local councillors, our parishes and I though not content with the process we've been pushed into, also support this option as the only one viable for our area. We're working together to submit a joint statement directly to government ministers to make clear how disadvantaged this area will become if aligned with Peterborough rather than Cambridge; as well as sharing our disappointment that this process has not been able to address Newmarket's relationship to many of our daily lives.

QUALITY OF LIFE SURVEY 2025

The results of the County Council's third annual Quality of Life survey have now been published.

- **Happiness is at its highest point** since tracking began (84%), but loneliness (30%) and mental health struggles (28%) remain high, particularly with younger age groups.
- **Residents remain concerned about the cost of living and jobs and investment**, with 87% of residents reporting they personally feel concerned. Just under two thirds (62%) also report concern over the level of investment and jobs in their local area. This has been steadily increasing year on year.
- **A sense of community and pride of place continues to be strong.** Residents continue to feel safe in (85%) and have a sense of belonging to (76%) their local communities. Around half (48%) of residents are involved in their local community in some way.
- **Residents' views on Cambridgeshire County Council's performance are also the most positive they've been.** Residents continue to trust the Council to make decisions (52%) and deliver value for money (47%). This is higher than national averages.

KINGSWAY SOLAR

With the Stage 2 consultation now live, I am working closely with colleagues, landowners and residents across the affected area to fully scrutinise the proposal. The consultation closes at 11:59pm on 29 October.

Apart from those in Brinkley, the main direct impact on our division is the power line corridor from the west of Brinkley, east of Six Mile Bottom with 50m high pylons to the Swaffham's before linking to a yet non-existent substation in Burwell. <https://kingswaysolarfarm.co.uk/documents/>.

HIGHWAYS

Work on the B1061 north of Dullingham is now scheduled to take place on 24 November with advanced notices going out on the 10th. Please ignore outlined potholes, defected areas are being properly patched with 100mm scraped out and replaced by a new two-part surface.

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East Cambridgeshire District Council Report

Highways : The repairs to the B1061 on the hill coming out of Dullingham have been delayed again. The work is now promised for the end of November 2025. At the County Council meeting in March of this year, the work was scheduled by officers for the financial year 2026/2027. I informed that meeting, that the road would have disintegrated by then and they promised to look at how it could be brought forward, so it appears that they were listening.

There has been a large amount of neglect of highways, and it is interesting that last month the County Councillor talked about resolving the issues of neglect, when it has been his group in power for over four years, during which time they have reduced budgets and opposed budget amendments made each year by the Conservative group to increase the spend on highways.

I will continue to hold the administration to account. If there is any work that you believe requires work, please contact me and I will raise this with Highways and aim to get it done.

Council Reorganisation : The response to the Government's imposed Council reorganisation continues to develop. Last month, I mentioned that there were four options currently being worked on. There are now five!! The latest proposal is for Huntingdonshire to become a unitary authority. However, I do not think that this is viable, as the population will be considerably below the 500,000 that Government requires.

Option A splits the area, north and south, with Peterborough, Fenland and Huntingdonshire in the north and South Cambs, Cambridge City and East Cambridgeshire in the south.

Option B has South Cambs and Cambridge City together, with Peterborough, Huntingdonshire, Fenland and East Cambridgeshire as the other unitary.

Option C has the area split west/ east, with South Cambs, Cambridge City and Huntingdonshire in the west and Peterborough, Fenland and East Cambridgeshire in the east.

Option D has Greater Peterborough in the north, which would constitute the current Peterborough unitary plus the northern half of Huntingdonshire as one unitary, with the southern half of Huntingdonshire, Fenland, South Cambs, Cambridge City and East Cambridgeshire making the second unitary.

The response to Government stating the final decision from the councils is required by 28th November and East Cambridgeshire District Council will meet on 20th November to decide our response. A lot of the work done is not around the best geographical fit, but financial and operational considerations, due to the heavy debts that some Councils have and the likely funding from Government. East Cambridgeshire District Council has no external borrowing and pride itself on strong financial management, whereas Cambridge City and South Cambs have very large debts, each in excess of £200m.

The whole process now seems to be driven by various political priorities, especially in Peterborough, Cambridge City Council, South Cambs and the County Council. The solution should be about what is best for delivering quality services to residents. I will continue to keep you updated, but welcome and feedback or comments.

Kingsway Solar

The statutory consultation has started and will run until 29th October, so please give your views and attend one of the public engagement meetings. Kingsway Solar is the 3,700-acre proposed solar farm, which will start next to Brinkley and encircle West Wratting and Weston Colville. It will take prime agricultural land out of food production and will destroy communities. This cannot be right.

The power generated will then be taken by overhead pylons to the substation at Burwell, a distance of over 10 miles. Please help stop this unnecessary development close to our community.

Waste Services

Full details have been sent to every resident, and I will place those details on my Councillor Facebook page, so please visit that. The changes are due to happen on 1st June 2026, so there will be more updates coming out in 2026. If there are any questions on the new waste system, please contact me.

If there is anything concerning you, please contact me. I am here to help on any matter over which you have concerns. I have not done surgeries previously, because I am able to visit residents or meet them, wherever is suitable for them, rather than making residents come to me. I am available to all.

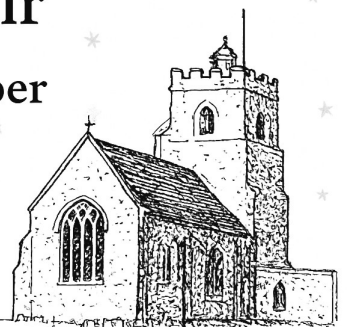

Jason Middleton / An Introduction to Gemstones - Jason's talk ventured into the fascinating world of Gemstones. The talk focused on the different gemstone families and their basic properties. Where and how gem stones are mined, cut and fashioned.

Gemstones are very rare natural minerals with 1000s available on the market, many of which we will never have heard of. Gems are usually set in one of the four noble metals – which are all hallmarked, they are gold, silver, platinum and palladium. White gold is gold with silver added, rose gold is gold with copper added and palladium is a more modern and cheaper metal.

Jason then passed some gemstones around the room for us to handle, I didn't realise quite how large a one carat diamond was, some of the other gemstones we handled were opal, ruby, tourmaline and a pearl we also handled a piece of larva rock which has many minerals in it.

Jason informed us that emeralds were the most precious and expensive gemstone. The basic gemstone families are: diamond, corundum, beryl, quartz, organic and others. The organic family include amber, jet, pearl and coral. The 3 countries that hold the largest collection of gemstones are: 1st UK, 2nd Russia, 3rd Iran. Jason offers other talks focused on gemstones and jewellery, including: History of Jewellery: Explores the role of jewellery in human history from ancient civilizations to modern times, Pearl: Focuses on pearls, their production, and famous examples, Jewellery of the Rich & Famous: Highlights celebrated gemstones and jewellery owned by celebrities.

Our next meeting will be held on **Tuesday 4th November** and instead of a speaker we will be **Making a Christmas Decoration** to decorate our tree at the St Peter's Church Tree Festival and the competition will be the best decoration made.
